Step 1 *Assess digital learning & tutoring considerations*

Step 6 Obtain your training materials

We strongly suggest, but do not require, the textbooks *Tutor 8* for Basic Literacy and *I Speak English*, 5th Edition for English Language tutors. These books are useful for volunteers both during training and throughout involvement as a tutor.

These are available for purchase at \$25 and may be picked up at the Literacy Volunteers of Bangor office by appointment, or may be ordered at newreaderspress.com/teacher-resources for \$23 plus tax and \$7 shipping. Alternately, you may borrow a copy for the duration of the training. Supplementary materials will be provided electronically to all training participants.

More about the online training modules:

We'll be using training modules developed by ProLiteracy, a leading resource and champion for adult education and literacy worldwide. Literacy Volunteers of Bangor is one of over 1,000 member organizations in the U.S. and 32 countries worldwide that provide adult literacy instruction, including 11 in Maine. You will need to create a free account on ProLiteracy Education Network at proliteracyednet.org/lvbangor.

Cornerstone is the Learning Management System (LMS) that runs ProLiteracy Education Network. It can be accessed from any web browser. For use on a tablet or smartphone, there is a Cornerstone app for both Apple and Android. Some tips:

- Prior to logging in for the first time, watch the two-minute video demonstrating navigation of the site: <https://youtu.be/07DlbWUVLEQ>.
- Browser must allow pop-ups from site (remember settings)
- Uses Adobe Flash
- Uses audio
 - Notes tab includes transcript
- Progress is saved if you exit in the middle of a module; you can opt to restart or resume.
